Hovey reported that nothing had been received on the 404 application or on the Tim Tollefson culvert matters. Marvin thought that Tim had told him some time ago that the township wanted him to buy the culvert.

A request for a \$250.00 donation to the Northern Plains RC&D Council was denied.

Dues to the North Dakota Water Users Association in the amount of \$300.00 was approved.

The budget request and approval of \$13,335.00 was reviewed. This is the first levy for the Resource District in many years and the Commissioners had suggested that rather than go several years without a levy and then request a fairly large levy that we make a smaller levy each and every year. The Board decided that this would be a good suggestion and we will do so next time we are requested to submit a budget.

Kenneth Reis reported on a beaver dam on the Oak Creek in the vicinity of Vance Anderson's farmstead (Kittleson place). Because of the urgent nature the beaver dam was removed with dynamite and a bill from Keith Edlund in the amount of \$200.00 was approved. We are to pay this bill and then send copies to Foster and Wells County for 10 percent and 60 percent reimbursement.

Hovey explained that there will be an increase in our liability insurance due to the fact that the State of North Dakota has lost its sovereign immunity in a recent court decision. This means that we need insurance to coverage our liability on the four dams in Eddy County. This increase will appear in our next billing statement.

Vouchers for the months of July through December for Board members were approved.

Due to absences it was decided that there would be no meeting in January and the next meeting would be at 10:00 on February 7th.

Kenneth Reis agreed to talk to the Township and the landowners.

The Board called Jeff Roel regarding the letter on the Tollefson complaint. He and the Federal agent will meet with Stan tomorrow and review the siltation problem.

Stan stated that he had met July 7, 1994 in Fessenden and on July 19, 1994 with the County Commissioners regarding the atmospheric research matters.

The regular July meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on July 5, 1994 at 9:00 AM in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Stanley Ripplinger, Marvin Tollefson and John D. Hovey, Secretary. Absent was Kenneth Reis. The minutes of the June 7, 1994 meeting were read and approved as read.

Rey Christ drain matter was discussed and Hovey was to contact State Water Commission to see if cost sharing was available. Stan Ripplinger said the person he talked to was Linda Weispfenning at Meeting with the Board was Alford Tollefson, Tim 224-4967. Tollefson and Mike Fandrich. The reason for their attendance was the water problems that go back to the Gross/Georgeson/Noack land. These problems were thoroughly discussed and the Board was advised by Hovey that due to the lapse of time (since 1960's or 1970's) it would be impossible to force closure of the ditches across the Gross/Georgeson/Noack land. Additional culverts in the southeast corner of Tim's property would provide some relief in releasing the water faster but there is no simple solution to this problem. Also, flowage of water in the NEI/4 of Section 26 (Eddie Haman quarter) was discussed and it is believed that the natural drain starting in Section 26 and going to the James River in Section 35 has silted in forcing water from the north to go east rather than south through that drain. To get the water flowing back to the river would provide additional relief.

It was decided to do the following:

- 1. Hovey to write a letter to Jeff Roel at Soil Conservation Service regarding clean out of drain. Request that he engage federal employee (same one used on Glenn Walz matter) to determine the amount of siltation.
- 2. After siltation determined Mike Fandrich to do a survey of NW1/4 of Section 25 and NE1/4 of Section 26 to set old ditch line and how much needs to be removed.
- 3. Tim Tollefson will check with Rockford Township about their paying for the cost of pipes in the southeast corner of his property. He will then get back to the board.

The Board then addressed the Atmospherics Research Board letter dated July 7, 1994 regarding the meeting in Fessenden. Stan Ripplinger will attend.

The Sheyenne and Warwick dam problems were discussed. It was decided that we would wait until Eddy County had been declared a part of the disaster area and see if we can get some FEMA funds to correct these problems. Met with Stan Ripplinger regarding Stanley Dodds matter.

I called Jim Linseth at State Water Commission (224-4988) and he suggested that the final decision on this matter be made by the SCS and absolutely with the approval of the ASCS because we may have some wetlands drainage implications.

He also said that the way it originally looks was that before any roads were installed the water probably accumulated right about where the intersection is and after it filled up to a point it spilled over to the northwest and west until it went to the river. This means that the natural flow goes across the Hulbert land and therefore would probably involve the Hulberts and Bill Starke.

He suggested some written document be drawn up at the end and signed by everyone so that there would be no further problems in the future.

Stan Ripplinger decided they would probably hold the Water Board meeting on Tuesday and if it got too hot to handle they would just call a halt to the proceedings until I can get back.

We also called Jeff Roel and Verle Marsaa at the SCS Office and they will go out on Monday, May 2nd and examine the ditch to see if the excavation done last fall took it down to the original bottom.

They wanted to know if a cut could be put in the road ditch on the south edge of Section 25 which would take the water to the east and away from Whetham's buildings. Eventually it would find its way to the river but probably would first cross Walter Weber's land. If the Board has no objections to such a cut Jeff Roel of the SCS Office would like a letter. The Board agreed that they have no objection if <u>all</u> land owners involved are agreeable. Hovey was authorized to write the letter to SCS.

The project planning documents received from the State Engineer's Office were discussed. Stan agreed that he will check with Norman Remboldt to see if the Rocky Run Joint Board wants to submit the "three mile channel" improvements for state funding. Stan will also call the state to see if the Ray Christ channel snag and clear operation would be eligible for state funding.

The March 22, 1994 letter from Robert Manly was discussed. The clean out was okayed by the Board subject to SCS approval.

The final item of business was two temporary water permits that had been granted to the National Guard to draw water from the Sheyenne River south of Hamar. No action was needed.

Wells County Board again agreed to check with the SCS to see that it doesn't violate 404 and will contact Lloyd's Construction for a bid and will also contact WELCO to see if their price still stands. If so, it was decided to go ahead with the repairs and split any difference in cost on the same 60 percent Wells, 30 percent Eddy and 10 percent Foster basis.

There was some discussion regarding the snow in the ditch by Ron Schaefer's. There is several miles where the ditch is completely full and an effort is going to be made to clean out the ditch approximately 2 1/2 miles west of the first drop structure. It is hoped that this will get the water moving and open the rest of the channel.

It was reported that all gates are in their winter position.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

The Water Board explained to the Township Board that it was not concerned with the ultimate responsibility for clean out but that the Water Board's understanding was that the Township was primarily responsible for the clean out and that they could then determine whether to seek reimbursement from third parties. A motion was made, seconded and carried to direct the Township Supervisors to remove this blockage by November 10, 1993. Secretary Hovey was instructed to send a letter.

The Board next met with Gene Masse, District Game Warden, regarding the Sheyenne and Warwick dams both of which are located on the Sheyenne River. Secretary Hovey was instructed to write a letter to the National Guard informing them that we would like to be considered for a training project and also to the State Water Commission requesting help in determining field work.

Hovey's file memo of October 19, 1993 regarding a meeting with Glenn Walz was reviewed. There appears to be nothing that the Water Board needs to do this fall and the matter has now been tabled.

Hovey reported that he faxed the Troske repair cost information to FEMA as requested by Stanley Ripplinger.

Rodney Lindstrom's letter regarding errors and omissions insurance was reviewed and Hovey was instructed to get a premium quote from Surety Title Company.

Ken Reis reported that he had received a call from Dennis Rimmereid (Tiffany Township Supervisor) regarding the need for a culvert between Sections 31 and 32 of 149-64. A motion was made, seconded and carried and Hovey was instructed to send a letter to Clay Sorenson at the State Highway Department in Devils Lake authorizing the installation of this culvert with the bottom of the culvert to be at the same elevation of the adjacent land level. Eddy County Water Resource Board November 2, 1993

Tim Tollefson filed two complaints with the Board. One was signed by himself and one by his father Alford.

Tim's complaint states that he wants the ditches that run from west to east across the old Pete Gross farm closed and the ditch that's in the road ditch on the west side of the road between Sections 1 and 2 closed and/or raise the culverts that run through the driveway up to the old Pete Gross farm. In addition he wants a culvert between the NE1/4 of Section 11 and the NW1/4 of Section 12 raised to reduce excessive water flows from the Geisinger land from flowing down across his property.

Alford Tollefson complaint states that when the service road for the irrigation canal was constructed between Sections 23 and 26 of New Rockford Township it acts as a dam and diverts the water east into Sheldon Township. There should be a culvert between Sections 23 and 26 to equalize the water and let it find its own course.

Stan will check minutes for previous action taken on the Georgeson property and Hovey is to photocopy those minutes and get copies to each of the Board members.

We also need to get a surveyor to:

- 1. Shoot the bottom of the culvert and adjacent land level between Geisinger and Tollefson property.
- 2. Possibly shoot some levels on the Georgeson property depending on what Stan finds in the minute book.

The file memo Hovey had sent to Ripplinger was read and discussed. It was decided that it was up to Glenn Walz to decide what he wants to do either to clean out the waterway or try and get permits to deepen it.

Ripplinger and Tollefson went to check the Alford Tollefson complaint. They first looked at the pipe between Sections 12 and 14 which appears to be below ground level. Also looked at the pipe in the beginning of the Georgeson driveway (old Pete Gross farm) which also appears to be at the bottom of the road ditch. It was decided to call the State Water Commission as it seems now that everything before 1995 must be treated differently than subsequent.

Stan Ripplinger reported that he called Norman Remboldt of the Wells County Board in regard to the Troske crossing and he said that they were going to meet with a federal employee on October 5th to see if we could get some disaster aid on it.

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MINUTES OF THE EDDY COUNTY WATER RESOURCE BOARD SEPTEMBER 7, 1993

The regular September meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held September 7, 1993 at 9:00 AM in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Stanley Ripplinger, Marvin Tollefson, Kenneth Reis and John D. Hovey, secretary. Also present were Glenn Walz and Merv Bjornson and Rod Iverson from the City of New Rockford. The minutes of the August 3, 1993 meeting were read and approved as read.

Merv Bjornson and Rod Iverson stated that the highway ditch on the southwest side of the railroad overpass has filled in and needs to be excavated. The City was told that the Water Board does not have funds to do this but that the Water Board would grant them permission to clean it out to the original depth. Merv and Rod were going to stop at the Commissioners' office and see if the County will take care of this matter.

> Secretary's note: The Secretary got a hold of Clay Sorenson who furnished the Board with a copy of an agreement dated September 12, 1975 whereby the North Dakota State Water Commission took on this project. A copy of this agreement was sent to Merv Bjornson.

Glenn Walz informed the Board that he had met with a soil scientist from the U.S. Game and Fish Department and Jeff Roel from the Eddy County Soil Conservation Service. He brought with him a September 1, 1993 memorandum (attached to these minutes) stating that the Fish and Wildlife had no objection to cleaning out the natural The depth of the cut was estimated to be 7 to 10 inches. drain. They also have no objection to cleaning out the drain by the railroad tracks in the NW1/4 of Section 7. If they decide to dig deeper than a clean out they will have to apply for a 404 Permit. Game and Fish also thought that more culverts were needed through Highway 15 and the Swift Road because due to elevations of flow into Section 14 is greater than the flow out. In other words the culverts in are running at full capacity and even though the culverts out have a greater capacity they are not handling as much water because they are not being fully utilized.

It was agreed that we would do the following:

- 1. Hovey is to call the State Water Commission and confirm that the 404 Permit should be obtained before the State Drainage Permit.
- 2. Glenn will contact the SCS to see exactly how deep he can go. He will then let us know.

Eddy County Water Resource District September 7, 1993 Minutes continued

- 3. Hovey is to call the Corp of Engineers and find out if a 404 plan would be needed if the cut is no deeper than a clean out. I should also ask them if they need to know about a snag and clear operation that will probably need to be done in the creek south of Reynold Christ.
- 4. Hovey should also check with State Water Commission and see if a State permit is required if the only work to be done is a clean out of a natural drain.

Glenn also requested assistance with costs of surveying. The Board did not feel that they were able to provide this assistance.

Secretary's Note: When Secretary Hovey talked to Clay Sorenson he explained that the Fish and Wildlife thought the culverts might be inappropriate through Highway 15 because of the elevations. (See text above). Clay agreed that this was possible and that he would check it out and let me know.

The Board agreed to delay until next month any work on the Tim Tollefson complaints. The Board did however agree to hire Fandrich and/or an engineer to shoot elevations and determine the elevations of those culverts.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Natural drain cleanout, Ed and Glen Walz property Subject:

On August 31 Lee Albright from the Valley City Wetland Management District and I met on site with the Eddy County District Conservationist Jeff Roel, his Technician Verl, and landowners Glen and Ed Walz concerning cleanout of a portion of a natural drain in the NW1/4 Section 12, T148N, R67W and in Section 7, T148N, R66W, near the railroad tracks bridge.

The purpose of the cleanout is to keep the easement wetland in Section 11 from overflowing, backing up water, and flooding the landowners land in Section 14. This natural drain flows from west to east towards the James River. It then forks in Section 14 to the north into section 11. There are two culverts between Sections 11 and 14 to transport water downstream. According to the landowners the flooding in Section 14 is due to all the excessive rain this year, landowners further west and north draining into the natural drain and the inappropriate size and number of culverts to properly transport the excess water downstream. The landowners feel that by cleaning out the above mentioned areas they can alleviate the flooding on their land in Section 14.

It was determined by Lee Albright and me that no wetlands would be affected by the proposed cleanout and the proposed activity does not interfere with the purpose of the FWS wetland easement #17x in T148N, R67W, Section 11, and therefore, the Service does not object to such activity.

Mention must be made that if the landowner should deviate from the initial proposed activity and decides to clean out the natural drain all the way to the east boundary of the easement property, a 200-500 foot non-maintenance buffer must be left untouched downstream of the wetland at the end of which point maintenance can then continue.

MINUTES OF THE EDDY COUNTY WATER RESOURCE BOARD AUGUST 3, 1993

The regular August meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on August 3, 1993 at 9:00 AM in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Stanley Ripplinger, Marvin Tollefson, Kenneth Reis and John D. Hovey, secretary. Also present were Richard O'Connor, Alford Tollefson and Tim Tollefson, and Glenn Walz. The minutes of the July 6, 1993 meeting were read and approved as read.

Stan, Marvin and Kenneth reported on their inspection of the Wells County gates subsequent to the July 6, 1993 meeting. They reported that all gates seemed in the proper position at that time.

They also reported that on July 15th the Water Board met at 8:00 AM in the Eddy County Courthouse with the Wells and Foster County Water Boards sitting as the Rocky Run Joint Water Board. Fabian E. Noack acted as secretary of that meeting and will be submitting minutes for inclusion in this minute book at a later date.

The Eddy County Board members reported that on July 28th the entire Board surveyed the water situation at Tim Tollefson's farm; on July 29th the entire board met at Glen Walz' farm and on August 2, 1993 Stan Ripplinger and John Hovey met with Glenn Walz at the Eddy County Courthouse.

The Board also made note that Duane Mullenberg has been checking the gates on both the Oak Creek and Emrick project and everyone seems satisfied with their operation.

Richard O'Connor reported that the work done in 1984 is silted in again. Another culvert is needed between the SW1/4NW1/4 of Section 19-149-67 (Eddy County) and SE1/4NE1/4 of Section 24-149-68 (Wells County). Also, the fence line between the NW1/4 and NE1/4 of Section 19-149-67 (Eddy County) needs to be cleaned out again. The Board gave it's approval subject to any swamp buster or other requirements as dictated by USDA. Richard will contact the townships about payment for the culverts and installation and will be in contact with this Board if additional help is required.

Alford and Tim Tollefson - Tim is getting water from the west and northwest over and across the land he farms in Section 12 of New Rockford Township (149-66). His complaint is that the culvert installed between the NE1/4 of Section 11 and the NW1/4 of Section 12 (in about 1986) is causing much of the problem. It is believed that this culvert was installed by Rockford Township. The Board agreed to inspect this culvert when the water recedes. The Board may have to hire an engineer to determine elevations. The engineer will also be instructed to check the elevation on the culverts that goes through the driveway into Quentin Georgeson's farm located in the SE1/4 of Section 2-149-66 (Pete Gross place). Tollefsons also complained about a ditch that had been dug in the ditch along the east edge of Section 2-149-66. Alford said he had filed a prior complaint many years ago. The Board was able to locate minutes from November 3, 1976 relating to this cut and that time found that the cut and the culvert in the southeast corner of Section 2 to be nonconforming and ordered the ditch filled and the culverts raised. Alford said the ditch was never filled but the Board does believe that the culverts were raised. Stan agreed to search the minutes to see if any explanation could be found for the ditch not being filled.

Glenn Walz appeared before the Board and complained about the amount of water which has ponded in the E1/2 of Section 14, NW1/4 of Section 13 and W1/2 of Section 12 all in Township 148, Range 67. Glenn estimates that he has lost about 100 acres of crop. Glenn believes that the inlet culvert between Sections 15 and 14 exceed the outlet culvert between Section 14 and 11 (highway culverts) which causes the ponding in Section 14. He also believes that the high spot in the pasture now owned by the Walz in NW1/4 of Section 12 is causing the water to back up in Section 12 and Section 11. The Board reminded everyone that one of the big problems they are going to have in this area has to do with the Fish and Wildlife easement which applies to the SE1/4 of Section 11 and will have to be worked around. Hovey reported that Clay Sorenson had called him and will obtain the culvert information through Highway 15 and forward to us. Clay later reported that those culverts were double 58 inches by 36 inch corrugated arched pipes equivalent to two 48 inch circular pipes. Irvin Loe was contacted by Hovey and reported that the three round pipes between Sections 15 (Jack McDowell's) and Section 14 are 36 inch culverts. (This information was given to Glenn Walz after the meeting.) Hovey reported that he had also contacted Kerry Backstrom who agreed to contact either Glenn or Hovey regarding what he could find on the North Branch as previously engineered back in the 1970's?. When he calls Hovey or Glenn they are to ask Backstrom about engineering studies, Also we'll ask about installing just a dike to quantities, etc. keep the water from going southeast.

> Secretary's Notes: After this meeting Hovey had several conversations with Esther Vogel at 224-2160 who is with the Highway Department and Lloyd E. Scott who is with the State Water Commission. Also talked to Dale Frink at 224-2750 who is with the Water Commission. Basically what they said is that the people involved will have to be the U.S. Corp of Engineers, U.S. Fish and Wildlife, the USDA, SCS and ASC Offices and the State Water

Commission. Lloyd Scott was unable to find a copy of the North Branch engineering study and suggested that we call Norman Rudel or the Wells County Board. He says that a permit submitted the must be to State Water Commission from Glenn setting forth what work is proposed. First thing to do is either find the previous engineering report or to contact a new engineer and have it redone. The State Water Commission will then act on the drain permit. He sees no objections from the State Water Commission but the permit application does need this information. I also talked to Kerry Backstrom who told me that the Corp of Engineers relies on U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service decisions regarding the necessity for a 404 permit. He also said that after solving all of the above programs the final problem is going to be the Swamp Buster provisions which will have to be addressed through the ASCS He further stated that all wetlands Office. on Glenn's land must be designated and that Glenn should get this information as soon as possible. He believed that we probably would end up having to get a Section 404 permit from the Corp of Engineers.

August 10, 1993 Hovey again searched the files in the Water Board filing cabinet and was unable to find any engineering report on North Branch. He did however find an old survey done by R.D. Reimer which he gave to Ed Walz together with the Water Board's topographic maps of Eddy County. Glenn, Ed and the ASCS people were going to meet at Glenn's on the afternoon of the 10th.

Kenneth Reis reported that the Township opened up the road between Sections 21 and 22 in Township 148-66. They will be installing a culvert to allow the water to go south on the west side of Section 22 until it hits the Rocky Run in that same quarter section.

Marvin said that the culverts out of Tim Tollefson's Section 12-149-66 property are smaller than the two culverts into that section located up in the northwest corner. The Board should check this out at the same time the engineer checks out the other culverts. Kenneth reported that he had received several oral complaints that the Kelly Creek should be taking some water from the Rocky Run but isn't. No action was taken on the oral complaints.

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE JOINT EDDY, FOSTER AND WELLS COUNTY WATER RESOURCE BOARD July 15, 1993

The special meeting of the Eddy, Foster and Wells County Water Resource Board was held on July 15, 1993 commencing at 8:00 a.m. at the Court House at New Rockford, ND with members present as shown on the attached registration list. Mr. Norman Remboldt was named chairman of the joint board meeting which had been called by John Hovey, secretary-attorney for the Eddy County Water Resource Board.

Mr. Hovey indicated that the three main subjects to be discussed at this joint meeting were as follows:

1. How are the Oak Creek and Emrick drains working?

e 5.

- 2. What is the status of the Emrick drain and Oak Creek drain control system?
- 3. The Joe Troske complaint on Section 14 of Superior Township in Eddy County

A resume of the above mentioned agenda was reviewed at length with much input from the members of the board in attendance. It appeared that the drains were working fairly effective except in a three mile portion of diversion channel on Oak Creek Drain. Some of the problem in the lack of adequate drainage is the fact that debris and other growth has accumulated in the ditches. It was mutually agreed that if the drains are to be effective there must be annual maintenance. It was felt that the lateral drains should be maintained by the farmer involved and the main drainage ditch should be properly maintained by the water boards involved. Since the Rocky Run channel is not in a legal drain and the boards apparently are lacking in financial support from the taxpayers, it would appear that the drains will become less effective unless some means of repair and maintenance are established in the near future.

The operating procedure of the gates in connection with the Oak Creek drain and the Rocky Run drain was reviewed. The operational plan of the Oak Creek drain was established by a written document dated January 9, 1990 and amended on March 26, 1991. After the discussion on this subject, it was mutually agreed that the operational plan in connection with the Emrick drain would remain the same but the operating plan on the Oak Creek drain would provide that all gates should be open 50% during the summer month with the balance of the plan to remain without change.

Next the boards reviewed the problem in connection with Section 21 and 22 in Superior Township. The Eddy County board indicated that they had expended the sum of \$388 to repair a portion of the road in this area and therefore the cost of the same should be the same as the original project, namely 60% of the cost by Wells County board, 30% by the Eddy County board and 10% by the Foster County board. Also an estimate of the cost to alleviate the complaint of the Troske family located in the SW¹/₂ of Section 14, Superior Township, was reviewed. The board had received an estimate of \$2100 from the Welco Construction Company of Harvey. At this point, the landowner apparently cannot cross the drain in order to properly farm the land on each side of the same. It was mutually agreed that contact would be made with the Wells County SCS office who in turn would review the above matters with the Eddy County SCS director. Thereafter, it was agreed that the findings of the two SCS offices would be submitted to all members of this board. The continuing disagreement with the Engels family concerning the drains were reviewed. It was stated that some progress has been made since Jeff Engels has met with the Wells County board recently and hopefully this communications process will continue. It was felt strongly that if the property owners, namely the Engels family, would have cooperated when the drain was installed, this particular problem at the present time would not have occurred. In any event, it was agreed that the Wells County Board would continue to work with the Engels family and keep the Eddy County and Foster County board advised periodically.

At the conclusion of the discussions, it was felt that a joint meeting should be held on an annual basis. The purpose of the annual meeting would be to discuss mutual drainage problems including means and methods of maintaining the different drains to the benefit of a majority of the farmers who are benefiting therefrom. All members of the boards agreed that an annual meeting should be held and probably during the last half of June or the first half of July would be the best time for such a meeting.

There being no further business, it was moved, seconded and carried to adjourn. Motion carried.



I have enclosed the final cost breakdown by County for the Oak Creek project. Note the last page is a summary showing cost figures of \$32,659.60 for Wells County and \$6,947.34 for Eddy County. These reflect the forty percent (40%) cost sharing as required.

I have also reviewed our records to determine the amount of time spent on engineering services for Rocky Run. The total time spent on Rocky Run amounts to 114.5 hours @ \$30/hour or \$3435.00. This does not include anything for mileage or other costs.

The State Water Commission has agreed to participate in all costs associated with the Rocky Run improvements with the exception of the culverts through the section line at the Reis farmstead. The following is a summary of costs for additional work on Rocky Run considering these monies.



In any event, the Board did not take this matter to the County Commission at this time because apparently you are anticipating some additional cost sharing from the State Water Commission on these items. We think that the State participation should be determined first and then the request should be made by the Rocky Run Joint Board to the Eddy County Commissioners in a letter setting forth all of the details. Our Board doubts that the Eddy County Commission will be very supportive in view of their previous letter stating that they do not intend to participate in any drainage project.

The regular December meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on December 1, 1987, at 10:00 A.M., in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Stanley Ripplinger, Kenneth Reis, Marvin Tollefson and John D. Hovey, Secretary.

The minutes of the special meeting held on November 12th, 1987, were read and approved as read.

Stan Ripplinger reported that he had received a telephone call from Norman Rudel last evening. Norman informed Stan that Section 61-21-32 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that where the cost of any bridges and culverts installed on county or township roadways shall be assessed 40% to the counties involved and 60% to the district. The figures he gave Stan was that the total pipe costs in Eddy County were \$17,369.00 and stated that Eddy County's share would be \$8,536.00. This latter figure does not equal 40% of the former figure and, therefore, Hovey was instructed to write a letter to Norman Rudel directing that the Rocky Run Joint Board do the following:

- 1. The request for county participation should be made in letter form from the Rocky Run Joint Board to the Eddy County Commission.
- 2. A copy should be mailed to the Eddy County Water Board.
- 3. Hovey is to suggest that the Rocky Run Joint Board wait with writing this letter until such time as the State's share is actually determined.
- 4. The Joint Board should be advised that the Eddy County Water Board was very surprised at this request at this late date since this was the first mention of it.
- 5. Hovey is to inquire as to when the Joint Board first decided to raise this cost participation since these proposed participation figures have not been used in any prior computations.
- 6. It could be pointed out to the Joint Board that they should not expect much support from the Eddy County Commissioners in view of the commissioners previous letter stating that they would no longer be responsible for any drainage costs.

It was suggested that all members attend the North Dakota Water Users Association Convention in Jamestown, North Dakota, on December 7th and 8th, 1987. Per diem and mileage vouchers were approved through the December 1, 1987, meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.



The following is a breakdown of costs for all Rocky Run Improvements as have been discussed by the Joint Board. This year's construction items have been described in more detail because of the nature of the work completed.

As of December 8, 1986 the following items were completed or partially completed at a cost of \$16,724.10 paid in partial payments one and two of the Oak Creek construct contract:

- 1) Clean out of the bridge between Reis and Seiler
- 2) Channel improvements on Paul Reis (S-1/2 Sec. 21)
- 3) Channel improvements on Kenneth Reis (Sec. 28 & 29)
- 4) Channel improvements on Duane Mullenburg (W-1/2 Sec. 29)
- 5) Channel improvements in the NE-1/4 of Sec. 31 (above Kittleson Crossing)
- 6) Channel improvements at the Barlow Road above and below the railroad bridge.

During several Joint Board meetings decisions were made to transfer the cost of some items out the Rocky Run proposal and shift them to the Oak Creek Project. These will be deducted later as costs are explained and divided into specific items. The total funds expended during the 1987 construction season came to \$49,143.94. This is represented as a total cost of \$65,868.04 paid under the Oak Creek construction contract.

The following is a breakdown of the 1987 expenditures and reasons for some additional costs involved in competing this work.

Stan Ripplinger reported that the Texas Crossing on the Joseph Troske land in Superior Township is completed and paid for.

Stan Ripplinger and Kenneth Reis reported on a meeting they *Marvin Tallifan* attended July 20, 1987, at Fessenden regarding the Emrick Drain. At that meeting it was agreed that Eddy County would pay all costs of leveling spoil banks and disposing of rocks in Section 21 (Paul Reis land). The estimated cost of this work is approximately \$1,800.00. The diking at the Kenneth Reis farmstead will be paid out of Oak Creek project funds. Stan Ripplinger will contact Norman Rudel to make sure that the contractor does the work in Section 21 when he moves down to remodel the dike. Stan Ripplinger will also obtain a copy of the minutes of the July 20, 1987, Fessenden meeting.

The Survey Report from Interstate Engineering was reviewed and their bill in the amount of \$189.79 was approved. A motion was made, seconded and carried to have the core samples taken.

A bill from Warren Duvall for the balance of tuition, course credits and mileage in the amount of \$126.20 was approved.

The July 14, 1987, notice of meeting in Devils Lake regarding the stabilization of the lake itself was discussed. It is suggested that this is quite important to our area and anyone who can make it is urged to attend.

Stan Ripplinger and John Hovey conducted an on-sight inspection of the Oak Creek Canal work, but found nothing going on at the present time because of ground water conditions.

Meeting of the Joint Water Resource Board of Wells, Eddy and Foster Counties was held on July **2**, 1987 at 8:09 o'clock P.M. at the Wells County Courthouse in the City of Fessenden.

The meeting was called to order by Norman Rudel, Chairman. The following members were present: Duane Mollenberg, Foster County and Stanley Ripplinger, Eddy County; also present was Vincent A. LaQua, Attorney; Mike Gunsch, Engineer for American Engineering; Marvin Tollefson, Kenneth Reis, Paul Peis; also present were Richard Leintz, Donald Marchus, Sidney Gunderson and Norman Remboldt, members of Wells County Water Resource Board.

The engineer gave an up-date on the progress and construction of Oak Creek Drain. Certain areas where problems existed on the lower end of Oak Creek Drain were discussed and that certain improvements and additions be completed. It was moved by Stanley Ripplinger that:

- 1. Improvements in Sec. 29-148-67 (Kermit Skadberg) with the texas crossing at additional cost of \$3,500.00.
- A 100 ft. Texas crossing to be installed between center of Section 21 & 22-148-66

The regular July meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on July 7, 1987, at 9:00 A.M. in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Stanley Ripplinger, Marvin Tollefson, Kenneth Reis and John D. Hovey, Secretary.

The minutes of the June 2, 1987, meeting were read and approved as read.

Kenneth Reis reported on a meeting held at his farm on June 2. Present at that meeting were Kenneth Reis, Paul Reis, 1987. Duane Mullenberg, Steve Hoetzer and the entire Wells County Water Board. Page 2 of the American Engineering letter of June 24, 1987, talks about the additional work under consideration which resulted from the June 2nd meeting. Duane Mullenberg indicated that Foster County would agree to splitting of all additional costs (\$2,400.00 channel improvements in Section 21 and \$6,500.00 dike improvements) on the same basis as before. Namely 30% Eddy County, 10% Foster County and 60% Wells County. Stan Ripplinger reported that in a later telephone conversation with Norman Rudel, Wells County took the position that Kenny Reis should pay for the additional dike work, but seemed to be agreeable to splitting the costs of the Paul Reis channelization in Section 21 according to the above formula.

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A motion was made, seconded and carried that the Section 21 channel improvements should be split according to the original formula for downstream improvements (30% Eddy County - 10% Foster County - 60% Wells County), but that the Kenneth Reis dike was a feature in the original Oak Creek Project and that any modifications should be a cost to the project since the original design apparently was faulty allowing water to back up around the east end. Stan Ripplinger will contact Norman Rudel about this Board's position.

The next matter addressed was the Troske Texas Crossing. Stan met with Don Schaefer, Robert Johanns and Joe Troske on July 6, 1987. They inspected the site. Joe indicated he would like a 30 ft. wide crossing for his equipment. Schaefer and Johanns estimated the cost at \$2,400.00. They now say that they will need a dozer to trim some banks which results in the slightly increased cost. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the work. Stan Ripplinger will notify Schaefer and Johanns.

The Kelly Creek headwaters was next discussed. It was agreed that Hovey should contact Interstate Engineering and ask them to send a survey crew out to take some elevations. This in hopes that the exact outlet to Kelly Creek from the Rocky Run can be

determined. Then if the cost is not too great we would have Interstate take some core samples to see if there has been any diking done at the throat of Kelly Creek.

The budget for the 1988 calendar year was discussed, completed and filed with the County Auditor.

The regular May meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on May 19, 1987, at 9:00 A.M. in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Stanley Ripplinger, Kenneth Reis, Marvin Tollefson and John D. Hovey, Secretary.

The minutes of the April 7, 1987, meeting were read and approved as read.

Stan Ripplinger reported that he had talked to Duane Mullenberg regarding the blockage at the headwaters of Kelly Creek. Duane Mullenberg said he would contact Kenneth Reis. Kenneth Reis reported that Duane had not talked to him.

Stan reported on a meeting he attended in Jamestown on April 14th. After that meeting four representatives from the Stutsman, Foster, Wells and Eddy Water Resource Districts met to discuss the formation of an Upper James River Joint Board.

The proposed resolution to enter into a Joint Upper James River Watershed Board and the operating agreement itself was next discussed. Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried the Eddy County Water Resource District passed the necessary resolution to enter into this agreement. The resolution and agreement were then signed by Stan Ripplinger and the Secretary was instructed to forward these documents to the proper parties.

A motion was then made, seconded and carried to again sponsor one teacher from each of the Sheyenne and New Rockford School Districts to attend the WET Workshop in Washburn, North Dakota, during July of 1987. The Water Management District will pay the registration fee of \$65.00; the credit fee of \$24.00 and 20¢ per mile to and from the seminar. The Secretary was to inform the Superintendents of the two School Districts of this offer.

Kenneth Reis then filed a Complaint with the Board signed by himself, Vance Anderson and Paul Reis regarding blockage done on the upper reaches of Kelly Creek. The topographic maps which we have in our files were examined, but the contours are in five foot intervals and it is very difficult to tell exactly where the Kelly Creek overflow intersects the Rocky Run. An on-sight site inspection of the property was done and while it is difficult to tell if any diking had been done in past years it is very obvious that the work that has been done this past year in conjunction with the Oak Creek Project is blocking any overflow into Kelly Creek and will have to be moved. Stan will mention this to the Joint Rocky Run Board at its next meeting.

Stan Ripplinger was going to pick up copies of any minutes which the Rocky Run Joint Board had in an effort to see if any diking

had been done at the time Kittelson's dam was taken out. We will then have a surveyor come in in an effort to determine the exact location of the headwaters of Kelly Creek.

RE: SB 2507 - Recent Developments

I. <u>Swampbuster</u>. On Thursday, March 5, 1987, Bob Thompson, Bob Garske, Keith Bjerke, and Murray Sagsveen met with ASCS and SCS officials in Washington DC concerning Swampbuster. After the meeting, there were different views concerning the outcome of the final Swampbuster rules. Bob Thompson from North Cass WRD felt that we could live with Swampbuster. Murray Sagsveen, representing the North Dakota WRDs Association at the meeting, perceived that the final rules would be extremely tough. Among other things, the delegation discussed the definition of wetlands, mitigation, clean-out of existing natural and artificial channels, and exemptions for the several existing ongoing projects in North Dakota.

Since the meeting, there have been differing views of Swampbuster, based partly on SB 2507. Those opposed to SB 2507 have testified that Swampbuster will be better than SB 2507, and SB 2507 should therefore be killed. Those who are concerned that Swampbuster will be extremely tough believe we should give SB 2507 a chance, to see if state wildlife groups can help us in our efforts to make Swampbuster more flexible.

In the first indication from Washington of the final outcome of Swampbuster rules, North Dakota, and some water resource districts in particular, have been dealt a devastating blow. In September, 1986, the Department of Agriculture came out with an exemption for those projects which had an assessment area voted on by affected landowners prior to December 23, 1985. The exemption included all wetlands "reasonably contemplated" to be drained as part of the project. In January, 1987, the ASCS changed the earlier exemption and stated that drains would be exempt only if they were "specifically identified" in the project plans. This would kill most ongoing projects, including six in Wells County, two in Bottineau County, and projects in Richland, Ramsey, Grand Forks, and other counties.

The Wells County ASC and others sent the necessary information to the state and federal ASCS asking for clarification, indicating that based on the September, 1986 exemption, the ongoing projects should be considered exempt. The ASCS in Washington DC issued its ruling on April 2, 1987, and <u>ruled that ongoing projects would not be exempt. In other words, the September 1986 exemption is revoked, and the projects in North Dakota which have expended thousands of dollars but have not yet been constructed are stopped, unless the farmers in the assessment area decide not to participate in the Farm Program.</u>

Bob Thompson and Keith Bjerke both testified at the hearing on SB 2507 that based on their meeting in Washington DC, and with Milt Hertz doing everything possible for North Dakota, we could live with Swampbuster. This first ruling from ASCS concerning Swampbuster is very strong against North Dakota, and should remove any doubt about how tough Swampbuster is and will be. II. <u>State Wildlife Groups</u>. Through SB 2507, state wildlife groups have committed to working with North Dakota water groups concerning Swampbuster and improvements to Garrison. Without SB 2507, they will not have the necessary vehicle to exert their considerable influence on national environmental organizations concerning these issues. With the April 2, 1987, ASCS ruling to revoke the Swampbuster exemption for existing projects, I am convinced it would be a serious mistake not to establish state wildlife groups as our allies. If a very solid North Dakota delegation like the two Bobs, Keith, and Murray, meeting with Milt Hertz, cannot achieve consideration of North Dakota's interests, we will definitely need allies.

Mike Dwyer, our Executive Secretary, has preached to us that water interests need to develop alliances with other interests to be a powerful and effective lobby. Through SB 2507, we have the opportunity for a very effective and beneficial alliance with state wildlife groups.

Since the controversial parts of SB 2507 will not take effect until July 1, 1989, I believe we can take advantage of this unique opportunity with very little risk to us. I hope we do so.

III. <u>Audubon Letter</u>. On March 19, 1987, the Audubon Society wrote to Governor Sinner indicating they do not support the Lonetree Reservoir. The North Dakota Wildlife Society wrote to Governor Sinner stating that Audubon has always been opposed to Lonetree, but that they were convinced they could convince Audubon to support a small mid-Dakota reservoir as part of Garrison if SB 2507 passes. The state wildlife interests further stated that they considered it to be their responsibility to pursuade Audubon that support for Swampbuster adjustments and a small reservoir for Garrison was in the best interest of wildlife interests and North Daktoa.

I explain this to you so that no one will say that the Audubon letter was not explained. The letter simply states their past position, a position which the state wildlife groups must change in order for the SB 2507 process to work.

It looks as though the Senate will act on SB 2507 next week.

P.S. A short note concerning SB 2035. SB 2035 is an interim legislative council bill establishing a statement of policy concerning wetlands, water, and agriculture. It is a carefully developed policy statement supported by North Dakota's major farm groups, water groups, and wildlife groups. However, it is only a policy statement, and even with amendments, it will in not be sufficient to enable North Dakota's wildlife groups to work successfully to achieve benefits for North Dakota.

Again, whatever you position on SB 2507, I urge you to contact your Senator concerning this important legislation.

A call was placed to the State Water Commission regarding Vern Fahy's letter of April 25, 1984, to establish priority of payments. We told him we had no projects in the mill at this time nor did any appear to be good possibilities. They said that that was all they wanted to know.

Mike Bichler then met with the Board regarding the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 of New Rockford Township. He wants to take it out. He reminded the Board that the Board's position was that the culvert should be plugged until the two diagonal culverts between Sections 2 and 12 start to run, but that someone keeps removing the plug.

After much discussion, a motion was made by Marvin Tollefson and seconded by Francis O'Connor as follows:

This Board recognizes that there is a continuous water problem along the Southern edges of Sections 1 and 2 of New Rockford Township. This Board further recognizes that the topographical maps shows that absent all roads, there would be some flowage from West to East across the Southern edge of Section 1. This Board further recognizes that the aforementioned flowage was the apparent basis for the installation of the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 of New Rockford Township by the New Rockford Township supervisors. This Board further recognizes that while the culvert was installed between Sections 1 and 2 of New Rockford Township, there appears to this Board to be no adequate relief to allow those waters to escape from Section 1 and that the New Rockford Township Board apparently refuses to provide such relief. This Board further recognizes that the water that flows across Section 1 eventually should rejoin the water that flows through the diagonal culverts between Sections 2 and 12 of New Rockford Township if proper and adequate outlets had been provided. This Board further recognizes that the existing system of culverts is unfairly damaging to the interest of Wilcox and Bichler in Section 1 of New Rockford Township.

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> NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS THE RESOLUTION of the Eddy County Water Management District that the culvert now located between Sections 1 and 2 of New Rockford Township be removed. The foregoing Motion was unanimously carried.

The Board, for the record, wishes to state that it recognizes that this is a unique situation and that the action taken next above could be interpreted as an exception or variance to its general policy. The Board wants to make it clear that the aforementioned action is not intended to create the impression that this is a precedent signifying a change of direction to its general policy. It will be decided at the June board meeting as to how and when this culvert shall be removed.

It was reported that there will be a meeting of the Joint Rocky Run Board on May 2, 1984 at the Carrington Courthouse at 7:30 P.M. The object of the meeting is to meet with the Foster County Commissioners.

The question was again brought up regarding the cut in the ditch one mile North of Carl Throlsons. The September 7, 1983 and October 15, 1982 minutes were reviewed and it was pointed out that Gary Throlson had promised to fill in that cut. Fran O'Connor will get in touch with Gary before the next meeting.

The Board then met with the County Commissioners regarding the culvert problems on the Jim River North of Omie Allmaras. The Commissioners informed us that they had been out and made an on-site inspection and the Commissioners found the road to be acting as a dam and they have located another 6' culvert which they will have installed.

The planned low water crossing in Section 35, Township 150, Range 62 submitted by Harold Gleason was discussed. Assistant Secretary Ramstad relayed the State Water Commissioner's position that no permit would be necessary for the crossing if no more than $12\frac{1}{2}$ acre feet was dammed up by the crossing. A Special Meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on March 6, 1984, at 2:30 P.M. in the Eddy County Courtrooms. All members and the Secretary were present. The meeting was a joint meeting with the Wells County Water Resource District Board, Foster County Water Resource District Board, Eddy County Commissioners, and Engineers, John Becker and Steve Hoetzer.

Norman Rudel opened the meeting with a short review of the Oak Creek project to date. He explained that Steve Hoetzer had been employed to review the project and especially the down stream impact of the Oak Creek project on Rocky Run and the James River. He explained that the Eddy County Commissioners had written a letter stating there was no benefit to Eddy County and that they did not feel they should pay any portion of the project. The purpose of the meeting was to explain the project to all concerned and to answer any questions.

Bob Ludwig of the Eddy County Commissioners expressed their concern about putting any additional water into the Rocky Run. He explained that the Eddy County Commissioners had received numerous complaints from area landowners and that they didn't feel the project would benefit Eddy County.

Steve Hoetzer explained that 70% of the Oak Creek project now contributes to the Rocky Run on a regular basis and the remaining 30% on a very infrequent basis. He further explained that the Oak Creek project itself will not add 600 cfs, but after the project is completed and the work has been done on the lower end of the Rocky Run it is hoped that the Rocky Run will handle somewhere between 500 cfs and 600 cfs. He also pointed out that the Oak Creek project will be gated which will allow for management of the water to avoid any increase in peak flows.

John Becker then explained the improvements that will be made to the lower end of the Rocky Run. First he explained the improvements from Highway 281 to the river and then he explained what would be done from old Highway 281 on West.

There was much general discussion regarding problems along the lower end of the Rocky Run including the Joe Schafer field crossing; expected benefits to the lower Rocky Run; and that the State Water Commission controls the permit process and will not grant a permit for this project unless they are satisfied that the channel will handle the water and that the project will not add to peak flows. It was also pointed out that even with the improvements along the lower end of the Rocky Run, and especially East of Highway 281, there can be no guarantee given that all future flooding will be eliminated. Rather, it was acknowledged that there will be occasional flooding, but even when there is, it should be of shorter duration than in the past.

The Eddy County Board then met shortly with the Eddy County Commissioners in the commissioners' office. They expressed no additional concerns, but were advised to let our Board know if they had any future questions.

He had an unsigned copy of our April 12, 1983 minutes and he asked that the Secretary sign them which I did.

Charles Richter then met with the Board and stated that he had talked to the Bureau of Reclamation yesterday. Engineer Sam Kotchman says that the Bureau would not have to, but will be providing features on the Garrison Diversion Project to provide for the interception of water and diverting it to the James River rather than to the Robinson Coulee. This work is scheduled for completion in 1986. So if everyone could hold off until then, the problem should resolve itself.

Mr. Richter took a copy of the September 26, 1975 map regarding drainage improvements in Eddy County Drain No. 1 and will give that map to Engineer Kotchman. Mr. Richter says he thinks Kotchman would like to divert water to the river instead of the canals so perhaps part or all of the Eddy County Drain No. 1 features might be incorporated into the Garrison Diversion plans.

The North Dakota Water Resource dues bill of \$200.00 was presented and approved provided that the County Commissioners have not already joined.

The State Water Commission letter of January 3, 1984, regarding U. S. Fish and Wildlife request to build nesting islands in the

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unnamed lake in Sections 21 and 28 of Paradise Township was reviewed. There appeared to be no objection to this construction from our standpoint.

John Eisenzimmer's drainage application for Superior Township was reviewed. Mr. Eisenzimmer wants the Permit to approve the existing drain. There will be no new construction. The Board had no objections to the Permit provided that there would be no pumping of water by Mr. Eisenzimmer until after the Rocky Bun has crested.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

SECRETARY'S NOTE: At approximately 10:30 on November 22, 1983, I called the State Water Commission in Bismarck and talked to Mike Gunsch who is a subordinate of Dave Sprynczynatyk. I explained to Mr. Gunsch that several years ago the Eddy County Water Resource District had adopted a policy regarding the placement of culverts at land level instead of in the bottom of the ditch, In those instances where the ditch or the roadway has alterej the flow of

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incressed the Flow of water, or started the Flow.

water from its natural course, A I asked Mr. Gunsch if this policy was still a valid policy and he said that it was in "95% of the cases". He did say that final determination depended upon where the water eventually went. He indicated that if the water eventually found its way to the same location then an exception to that policy would probably be in order. This, of course, would depend upon the circumstances and whether the water would cross land different than from its natural flow. We also discussed that by placing culverts at land level, in certain cases this would result in water standing in the ditch. He agreed that in some cases this is the way it must be.

He did say that in the construction of roadways the County or whoever is building the road must design it so as not to impede the natural flow of water.

Francis O'Connor reported Norman Rudel had informed him that the Wells County Board has hired an engineer from Bismarck to get a second opinion on the overall plan for the Oak Creek Drain.

Francis O'Connor also reported that the culvert has been installed between Section 36 of Gates Township and Section 1 of New Rockford Township and that Engineer Becker was present at the time it was installed.

Bob Soderholm explained that the Eddy County Commissioners had received a letter from the Wells County Water Board asking whether or not the Eddy County Commissioners approved of the Oak Creek Drain project. The Eddy County Commissioners responded to that inquiry by their own letter stating they did not feel there was any benefit to Eddy County.

A general discussion between the two Boards was held on the Oak Creek Drain project with the County Commissioners taking the position that Eddy County should not be responsible for any financial participation in the project. It is their opinion that the entire cost of the project should be borne by the landowners within the drainage district or by Wells County itself.

The Eddy County Water Management Board explained their position on the Oak Creek project as is set forth in our minutes of the July 14, 1983, Special Meeting. We explained to the Commissioners that the Engineers Report, as we understand it, says that no additional work is needed on the lower Rocky Run should the Oak Creek Drain be approved. We further explained that the work to be done on the lower end of the Rocky Run as now included in the Oak Creek Drain project was a concession that we had obtained from the Wells County Board to partly offset previous existing flooding problems and that historically our Board has agreed to pay a proportionate share of those expenses should the same be necessary. Our share in the past has been 30%. At this point, the Eddy County Commissioners left for their own meeting.

The subject again came up regarding the repair and/or relocation of the concrete culvert between Sections 36 of Gates Township and Section 1 of New Rockford Township. Fran O'Connor will again visit with Gjestvang to see if the work has been done and if not will get in touch with some contractor who will get the work done immediately. The Oak Creek Control Agreement, as amended on June 24, 1983, was reviewed. Secretary Hovey was authorized to send copies of that agreement to the Wells and Foster County Boards.

From that letter and from what this Board has been able to find out, there will apparently be no funds available from Eddy County to help with the improvements on the lower Rocky Run which are spelled out in the "PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO LOWER ROCKY RUN - March, 1983", a copy of which are attached hereto, as well as the improvements and/or culverts to the driveway at the farm owned by Darlene Skaar which is known as the "Steinbach Farm".

It was unanimously agreed that the Eddy County Water Resource Board's first obligation is to Eddy County residents and landowners and with that in mind the Eddy County Board must insist that the work on the lower Rocky Run is not deleted from the Oak Creek project. However, since our Board can offer no funds to assist in the completion of this work, the entire cost will have to be borne by the assessed landowners; or out of the State Water Commission cost sharing; or from wherever.

If the Wells County Water Resource Board agrees to this and can complete the project without financial help from the Eddy County Water Resource District Board, the Eddy County Water Resource Board will not oppose the Oak Creek Project. On the otherhand, if the Wells County Water Resource Board cannot insure the completion of the lower Rocky Run improvements, then the position of the Eddy County Water Resource Board at the July 18, 1983, Drain Permit Hearing will be to actively oppose the/project.

The improvements as outlined here and as shown on the attached map are in accordance with the guide lines perscribed in the 1978 report on Rocky Run by the State Water Commission.

The improvements to the channel will exceed those outlined for phase II and the proposed culverts and existing will be slightly less. However the State Water Commission's design was based on 2200 CFS where I feel that the present capacity of the Kittelson Crossing is 600 CFS.

The channel improvements and culverts as proposed in section 29 will handle that flow.

The April 12, 1983, Special minutes were reviewed for the benefit of the New Rockford Township Supervisors. Engineer Becker's letter of May 1, 1983, regarding water flowage in the Wilcox area was reviewed and found to support the theory that in the absence of all roads some water would flow West to East across the south part of Section 1.

Wilcox stated that it was his position that the only way to solve the water problem in that area is to remove the culvert between Sections 1 and 2. He stated that he had met with Cary Backstrand in Bismarck from the State Water Commission who informed Mr. Wilcox that the water patterns have changed since roads were put in. Duane Weber indicated that if the approach between Wilcox and Bichlers on the North side of the road in Section 1 were removed, the water would move East along the North road ditch. The Board did not feel that would be a good solution since it would just cause more problems for Mike Bichler and other landowners to the East.

Mr. Wilcox doesn't feel that an outlet pipe from Section 1 to Section 12 would do him much good. He is willing to sit with his water which comes from his own land, but would prefer to have the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 removed. However, when the Board refused to take any action on the removal of the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 Mr. Wilcox stated he will think it over and if he decides to ask for an outlet culvert between Sections 1 and /2 he will go to the New Rockford Township Supervisors. The Water Management Board restated it's position that in the spring of each year hereafter, the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 shall remain closed until the culvert between Section 2 and 12 are flowing.

A letter from the North Dakota State Water Department regarding the re-grading and re-surfacing of Highway 281 from "the Divide" and thence North to the County line was reviewed. There appeared to be no apparent impact on water flows in that area and, therefore, no objections or recommendations will be filed. Minutes Page 2

An on-sight inspection was made. Scattered bodies of water were found to be standing in both Sections 1 and 12 along the roadside.

The following Motion was unanimously adopted:

- 1. The Board's engineer, John Becker of Carrington, shall conduct a field survey to determine the elevations along the South portion of Section 1 and the North portion of Section 12, and any adjacent land in the area that he deems necessary, to either prove or disprove the State Water Commission's findings that in the absence of all roads, some water would flow East along the South portion of Section 1.
- 2. If Becker's Report finds that in the absence of all roads, no water would flow West to East along the South portion of Section 1, then this Board will order the removal of the culvert between Sections 1 and 2.
- 3. In the event that the Board's Engineer's findings confirm that in the absence of all roads some water would flow West to East across the South portion of Section 1, then the Board will not order the removal of the culvert between Sections 1 and 2, but an offer will be made to Mr. Wilcox to install a culvert between Sections 1 and 12, at ground level, in order to provide an outlet for the water that accumulates on Section 1.
- 4. Should the final determination of this Board be that the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 remains in place, it shall be the further order of this Board that in the Spring of each year hereafter, the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 shall remain closed until the culverts between Sections 2 and 12 are open.

The regular April meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on April 5, 1983, at 10:00 A.M. in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Francis O'Connor, Stanley Ripplinger, Marvin Tollefson and John D. Hovey, Secretary. Also present were Clarence Wilcox and Dwayne Weber; John Eisenzimmer; Ed Walz, Glenn Walz and Quentin Georgeson.

The minutes of the March 1, 1983, meeting were read and approved as read.

The State Water Commission (Michael H. Gunsch) letter of March 3, 1983, was the first item of business to be discussed with Mr. Wilcox and Mr. Weber. Mr. Wilcox showed the Board a document dated October 11, 1979, signed by John Haugland as Attorney for Quentin Georgeson which was addressed to the New Rockford Township Board and directed them to stop work that had been agreed on by the New Rockford and Sheldon Township Boards at a July 3, 1979, meeting. In reviewing the minutes of the July 3, 1979, meeting, Mr. Wilcox stated that the subject of a culvert between Sections 1 and 2 was not brought up and, therefore, wondered why it had been later installed. It was pointed out again that the culvert between 1 and 2 was installed after the letter from Cary Backstrand had been received later that year. The Eddy County Water Resource District Board did not deny that it has the authority to remove the culvert between Sections 1 and 2, but, since this culvert was installed by the New Rockford Township and since the maps and engineers opinion is that some water should run east across the Clarence Wilcox land, this Board will not get involved in ordering the removal of the culvert. Since New Rockford Township has also indicated they will not remove the existing culvert, it was again suggested by this Board that perhaps Clarence Wilcox should attempt to get the New Rockford Township to install a culvert between Sections 1 and 12 which would give him an outlet for the water. Secretary Hovey was instructed to reply to Mr. Gunsch' letter and to notify Mr. Wilcox.

Johnny Eisenzimmer appeared before the Board in regards to the drainage he is doing on his land. He is considering the filing of an application for a drainage permit. He was given the application form and a copy of the State Water Commission letter dated May 16, 1980, outlining the drainage approval process.

The Walzes and Quentin Georgeson inquired about the complaint process that would be used to close illegal drainage. It was explained that this Board had never acted on such a complaint previously, but that before they would take any action they would require specific complaints against exact parcels of land, the estimated amount of acres drained, and when the drainage had been done. The Walzes and Mr. Georgeson

Francis O'Connor reported that Darlene Skaar had requested a culvert in the farm driveway on the farm that is known as the "Steinbach farm" if the upcoming Oak creek water project goes through. Fran O'Connor will take this request to the joint board meeting.

The board felt that someone should check on the Emrick Gates to see that they are all in the proper position for the spring run off. Fran will check with Arley Brackel regarding this matter.

Fran pointed out that there will be a meeting on March 13, 1983, at 2:00 P.M. in the Wells County Courthouse regarding the Oak Creek Drain assessments.

The board decided to check on the Kittelson water supply system to see how it has held up over the past winter. This was done and they found that there was water running in the Rocky Run and that the water supply seemed to be satisfactory.

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A Special Meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource Board was held in joint session with the Wells and Foster County Resource Boards on March 14, 1983, at 7:30 P.M. Present were all members of the Eddy County Board and all members of the Wells County Board. There was no representation from the Foster County Board. Also present was John D. Hovey, Secretary of the Eddy County Board.

Norman Rudel from the Wells County Board opened the meeting by apologizing to the Eddy County Board for not checking with Eddy County about the water level at check point E before opening the Emrick gates. He admitted it was inexcusable, but said it was inadvertent and that it won't happen again.

Stanley Ripplinger and Francis O'Connor stated they had visited with Paul Reis who has indicated that he wants the channel east of Highway 281 to handle the same water capacity that is able to flow under the highway bridge on 281. Since the Kittelson Dam is a control point on the lower end of the Rocky Run, it was decided that the capacity that could flow through Kittelson's road crossing would be a more logical target to shoot for.

Various suggestions were made as to what improvements could be done on the lower end of the Rocky Run. Since Mr. Reis has apparently changed his previous position to allow work done in his pasture, the following suggestions were made:

- Build a Texas crossing south of the Seiler farmstead.
- Channel improvements in Section 21 (owned by Reis) and Section 22 (owned by Seiler) to move the water on through to the James River in a more orderly fashion.
- 3. Move the culvert now located South of the Seiler farmstead to the Kenneth Reis road to provide additional capacity since it appears that the capacity at the Kenneth Reis farmstead is not equal to the Kittelson road crossing capacity.
- Perhaps build a Texas crossing running east and west on the Section line immediately north of the Kenneth Reis farmstead between Sections 21 and 28.

It was noted that there will be \$28,000.00 for lower Rocky Run improvements if the order creek drainage project passes.


The Eddy County Board informed the Wells County Board that although there was nothing they could or would do to interfere with the vote on the Oak Creek Project on March 15, 1983,

the Eddy County Board would adopt a wait and see attitude until the lower Rocky Run improvements were proposed and if they determined that those improvements would not satisfactorily remedy the water problem in the Kenneth and Paul Reis areas, the Eddy County Water Resource District would actively oppose the Oak Creek Project at the time of the State Water Commission Permit Hearing.

The regular February meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on February 1, 1983, at 10:00 A.M. in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Francis O'Connor, Stanley Ripplinger and John D. Hovey, Secretary. Also present were Lawrence Anderson, George Laber, Jr. from the New Rockford Township Board and Clarence Wilcox. Absent was Board Member, Marvin Tollefson.

The minutes of the January 4, 1983, meeting were read and approved as read.

The Board reviewed with Mr. Anderson, Mr. Laber and Mr. Wilcox the minutes of the prior meetings and the position taken by this Board regarding the installation of culverts in general, and the prior position taken on the installation and/or removal of the culvert between Sections 1 and 2 of New Rockford Township in particular. Mr. Anderson said that the New Rockford Township Supervisors had met with the Water Resource Board shortly after they received **G**ary Backstrand's letter. He said that Mr. Backstrand's letter was discussed at that meeting and that the Rockford Township Board thought they had the Water Resource Board's backing to install the culvert between Sections 1 and 2. He further said that we did not put this "backing" down in our minutes and he accused us of only putting down what we wanted to put down and what would benefit us at a later date.

Mr. Wilcox felt that the Water Resource District should order the removal of the culvert. The Board refused and stated that it was the responsibility of New Rockford Township. New Rockford Township said that they will not order the removal of the culvert unless and until they are instructed to do so, in writing, by our Board or the State Water Commission.

More general discussion was had together with a review of the map that had been furnished by Gary Backstrand. Clarence Wilcox was given a copy of that map. Clarence Wilcox stated that his land along the road had been farmed in years past, but recently had been in grass for a number of years until it had been broken up again. He says that after the ditch along the south edge of his land fills up it backs up onto his land before running east.

For reasons previously stated, Mr. Wilcox' complaint of 10/28/82, as restated in his further complaint of 1/4/83, were denied and this Board will not order the removal of the culvert.

A bill from the North Dakota Water Management Districts Association for 1983 dues in the amount of \$125.00 was approved.

The County Commission has instructed this Board to determine among themselves the staggering of their terms. Coins were flipped and the following terms were the result: • •

The regular January meeting of the Eddy County Water Resource District was held on January 4, 1983, at 9:00 A.M. in the Eddy County Courthouse. Present were Francis O'Connor, Stanley Ripplinger, Marvin Tollefson, John D. Hovey, Secretary, Dwayne Weber and Clarence Wilcox. The minutes of the December 9, 1982, regular meeting were read and approved as read.

Clarence Wilcox stated that he had met with the Rockford Township supervisors. Before removing the culvert between Sections 1 and 2, the Rockford supervisors want a document in writing from the Eddy County Water Resource Board instructing them to remove The board reiterated its previous position that it the same. will not initiate the removal of this culvert and stands on the position it took at its regular recessed meeting of November 9, 1982. The minutes of that meeting were read and reviewed with Mr. Wilcox and Mr. Weber. It was suggested to Wilcox and Weber that perhaps they should petition the Rockford supervisors for another culvert between sections 1 and 12 of New Rockford Township which would provide an outlet for this water to the south and They did not feel that this would help the situation much east. because the ditch along the south edge of section 1 would remain fulland keep the water table high. Wilcox and Weber indicated that they felt they were getting the run around between this board and the Rockford supervisors. At this point all previous minutes regarding this matter were reviewed to show once again that this board \underline{did} not order the installation of the culvert between sections 1 and 2 as apparently it has been suggested by the Rockford Township Board.

Marvin Tollefson suggested that perhaps we should get the New Rockford Township supervisors, and Wilcox and Weber, to meet with this Board to once and for all make it understood that this Board did not order the installation of the culvert. Hovey was instructed to send a letter to the New Rockford Township supervisors requesting them to meet with us at our February meeting.

The Board then met with the County Commissioners regarding the staggering of Board members terms. The County Commissioners will check their minutes to see who is up for appointment so that they can keep track of this matter in the future.
